These positions are with the Applied Research Laboratory for Intelligence and Security (ARLIS) at the University of Maryland. ARLIS is the University Affiliated Research Center (UARC) of the United States Office of the Undersecretary of Defense for Intelligence and Security (OUSD(I&S)). These are paid positions with flexible start and end dates and are open to master's students, Ph.D. students, and postdoctoral researchers. Because Acquisition and Industry Security are complex, interdisciplinary problems, these internships are open to a wide variety of majors and will give interns an opportunity to work directly with mission-critical problems and experience the excitement of working directly in intelligence and security spaces, tackling problems from different angles. Current opportunities exist for interns in business and public-policy fields to explore and gain meaningful work experience related to the intelligence and security of manufacturing technology and supply chains.

Qualifications

- Evidence of successful work on an independent business or policy project is desirable.
- Applicants may be at any stage in their graduate careers and working, or intending to work, in any business and/or policy area.

ARLIS is interested in hiring individuals that possess knowledge, skills, interest, and abilities in one or more of the following areas:

- Quantitative data research, including creating, maintaining, and analyzing large datasets
- Research and data collection in various laws, regulations, policies, and practices related to acquisitions, industrial security, and/or cybersecurity
- Producing technology-related and/or manufacturing-related policy briefings for members of the United States Government and/or the private sector
