Intervene:

- When students are confused because they made a decision and lost track of what they were doing.
- When students are working without communicating amongst themselves for a “long” time.
- When students ASK for help, as in when students are to the point where they become extremely frustrated.
- When a single student can't get involved with other team members. In other words, give this student a special tool to show the rest of the group so that involvement becomes necessary.

Intervention Questions/Comments To Pose To Students:

- Restate your decisions.
- What is it that you are trying to do?
- What is your definition of _____?
- Why?
- What do you think?
- What is the client asking?

Do Not Intervene:

- When students are in “deep thought” processes.
- When students are presenting their ideas, wait until their presentation is finished.
- When students are engaged.
