ADM. JAMES O. ELLIS JR., chairman of the UAG, completed his 39-year Navy career in 2004 as command and control of United States strategic and space forces. Ellis is a graduate of the Navy Test Pilot School and the Navy Fighter Weapons School, and was elected to the National Academy of Engineering in 2013.



MANDY VAUGHN, president of Vox Space. Vaughn previously worked as senior director of business development and mission management at Vox Space's parent company Virgin Orbit. She also worked for General Dynamics Mission Systems' Space and Intelligence Systems Directorate, and General Dynamics.



MARY LYNNE DITTMAR, president and CEO of the Coalition for Deep Space Exploration, has served as a senior adviser to NASA, the DoD, and the FAA. Dittmar was appointed by the Secretary of the Department of Transportation to the Commercial Space Transportation Advisory Committee for the FAA and is currently a member of the Executive Committee of the Space Studies Board of the National Academies of Sciences, Engineering and Medicine.
