Course Description

A special seminar for cooperative education and curricular practical training students. May be taken no more than twice for credit. Grading is Pass/No Pass

Reason

The pre-requisite of ECE 47000 required students to pay a fee for the course while on internship. The ECE faculty believe their experience can be documented without forcing them additional costs. In place of registering for ECE 47000, students will provide documentation to the Director of Undergraduate Programs to validate the internship experience and allow them to take ECE 39600 upon their return to classes. This in no way changes how students in the Co-Operative program register while on a work session, and they will continue to register for the appropriate course and pay the associated fees.
