

WANT TO BE A PROFESSOR IN ENGINEERING?

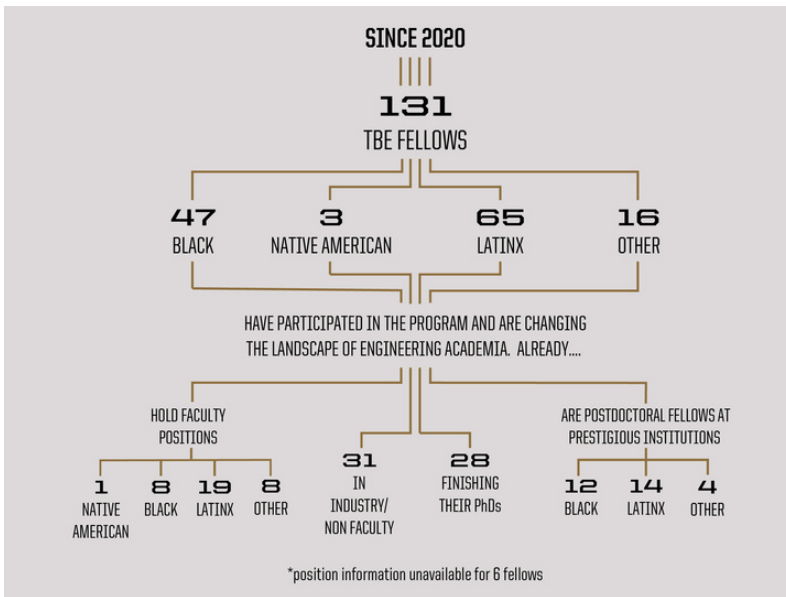
