How to get there

- ➤ In the situation of a medical emergency (serious illness or injury), call 911 for transportation.
- > If you can safely drive yourself, use a private vehicle to go to an approved medical provider.
- > Your supervisor or another designated person may drive you to an approved medical provider using a private or University vehicle.
- > If you or someone else drives a personal vehicle they assume liability to any damage to their vehicle or to any other vehicles if an accident occurs.
