- Upload to the both the digital poster (PDF) and the completed 2020_competition_presentation.ppt to <u>E2020</u> <u>website</u> by 11:59:59 on September 15, 2011.
- Attend and answer questions about your PtD project from 11:30 a.m. to 1:15 p.m. on September 20, 2011 at the Purdue Memorial Union Faculty Lounges.
- If you are selected as one of the finalists you will be required to present at the 3:30 – 4:45 afternoon session and receive your award at the 4:45 awards presentation
