Who, What, When, Where, Why

- WisDOT began its Highway Technician Certification Program (HTCP) in 1991 to comply with the requirements of CFR 637
- WisDOT outsourced the program operations, and the University of Wisconsin-Platteville has been the home of the HTCP since its creation



Staff

 The HTCP consists of 2 full-time staff members - the director and an office assistant

 HTCP courses are taught by approximately 25 part-time instructors - a mixture of academia, industry, and WisDOT

 A designated WisDOT employee serves as a part-time liaison to the HTCP

Customers

- The HTCP offers approximately 50 class sessions per year, ranging from 1 to 4.5 days in length
- Approximately 1,400 certifications were issued in 2009, including re-certs
- There are 1,986 individuals (277 WisDOT) holding 4,587 certifications (819 WisDOT) on the active certification list

WisDOT Benefits

- Access to university services classroom & lab space, website, printing, video production, accounting system
- WisDOT instructors are able to share their expertise outside of a "work environment"
- Industry and WisDOT testers are certified by a "3rd party"

UW-Platteville Benefits

- Revenue from the use of university services
- Civil engineering department shares use of lab equipment and classroom space

Ongoing Challenges

- Communication due to separate entities (e.g. WisDOT spec changes getting implemented in certification courses, HTCP receiving WisDOT-related inquiries)
- No centralized instructional site (Ray's Road Show)


