


Josemiguel Haro VP Communications



After Purdue's announcement back in 2021, the ambitious plan to renovate Schleman Hall and Stewart Center has finally been achieved. Student services including admissions, enrollment management, financial aid, and bursar and registrar functions will be moved to the modernized space in Stewart Center. The new admissions theatre has opened its doors to prospective students and PSEFers. Among other things, the Admissions Theatre is the new location for Engineering Information Sessions (EIS). In accordance with this location change and the new engineering building, the PSEF tour route has also been updated. Now, starting in Stewart Center, the tour moves north past Memorial Mall and to Wilmeth Active Learning Center (WALC). Here, the PSEFers have the flexibility to lead their groups through the Mechanical Engineering Building, the Engineering Fountain, and the Gateway Complex in their personal preference of order. Furthermore, if time permits, the Materials and Electrical Engineering Building (MSEE) and the Electrical Engineering building (BHEE) are conveniently located near the route and have great resources that add value to the prospective student's Purdue experience. The Outreach Committee has done amazing work formulating this new route, as well as training the rest of the organization on this big change!
