The Regenstrief Center continues to grow its presence on campus. On November 8th, we were fortunate enough to host Dr. Chiam, Associate Director of Research Informatics at the Value Institute in Christiana Care Health System. As one of the largest healthcare systems in the United States, Christiana Care Health System provides healthcare to over half of Delaware population as well as surrounding markets in neighboring states. Due to the recent paradigm shift in delivery and reimbursement of healthcare, the Value Institute, which is a multi-disciplinary research institute within Christiana Care was developed to study and construct healthcare delivery models that are aligned with Institute for Healthcare Improvement's Triple Aim of improving Population Health, Experience of

Care and controlling Per Capita Cost. In this talk, Dr. Chiam discussed an overview of Christiana Care Health System, the Value Institute, Christiana Care current efforts in healthcare delivery, including examples of both externally and internally-funded research and implementation projects, challenges as well as areas of healthcare research that are relevant to Christiana Care.
