This course is designed to connect students with top leaders in engineering, technology, and business through both classroom learning and meaningful engagement beyond the classroom. Students will explore leadership principles, career selection and mobility, and key business topics not typically covered in undergraduate engineering. Through interactions with accomplished executives from a wide range of industries, students will gain insight into real-world challenges, solutions, and opportunities. A defining feature of the course is the opportunity to build personal, authentic relationships with these leaders through structured networking sessions and small-group settings, including scheduled meals with executives. Students consistently highlight outside-of-class connections as one of the most valuable aspects of the experience, noting the accessibility of speakers and the lasting professional relationships formed. By the end of the course, students will have acquired up-to-date knowledge of business essentials required for corporate leadership.
