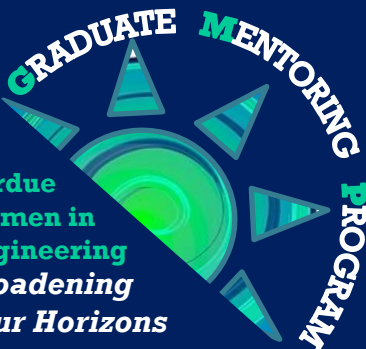
## PGSG Career Fair
