The Purdue Institute for Integrative Neuroscience (PIIN) offers a 6-week summer course aimed at assisting graduate students and post-doctoral fellows in the preparation of applications to the NIH for NRSA Individual Predoctoral or Postdoctoral Fellowships. The course will meet 6 times throughout the summer (May 30 – Aug 1, 2019) for 2 h each and will consist of an introductory lecture, intensive group discussions of written materials prepared by class participants, and a study section-style review panel. The main objective of this course is to help course participants develop competitive fellowship proposals in the area of neuroscience to be submitted to NIH.
