In this talk, I will focus on my varied experiences that will inform my leadership and vision for building on the existing strengths of the Purdue Policy Research Institute (PPRI) and expanding its role locally and nationally. One of my top priorities will be moving PPRI forward as a nationally-recognized institute for work on the ethical, legal, and social implications of technology.

Natasha Duncan is the interim associate dean for academic affairs and a clinical associate professor in the Honors College at Purdue University. She holds an undergraduate degree from City University of New York, Brooklyn College and graduate degrees (MA, PhD) from Purdue University. Prior to returning to Purdue as faculty, she was assistant professor of political science and director of the Honors Program at Mercyhurst University, Erie PA.

Dr. Duncan is a political scientist who specializes in international relations and comparative politics. Her research broadly focuses on international migration. Her 2012 book, *Immigration Policymaking in the Global Era: In Pursuit of Global Talent*, examines high-skilled labor migration and the role of immigration policy as a determinant in the movement of global talent. She also has published work on high-skilled labor migration, immigration policies in the facilitation of brain drains and gains, international migrant circulation, and naturalization and immigrant integration in the United States. She is currently working on research that examines the political consequences of emigration on countries of origin, and gender and migration.
