**Ag Data Collection:** 

How Companies Do It Wrong. How to Do It Right.

Todd Janzen, attorney at law, grew up on a grain and livestock farm in Kansas and has a passion for farming and dedication to the agricultural industry. Since 2012, much of his practice has focused on legal needs of farmers and ag-tech providers in handling agricultural data. He participated in the discussion that led to the industry's adoption of a set of core principles for collecting, storing, analysis and sharing agricultural data. He is the administrator for the Ag Data Transparent project. This work is supported by major commodity organizations, the American Farm Bureau

Federation, and National Farmers Union. Todd is a frequent author and speaker to many farm press outlets, such as Farm Journal, Successful Farming, and Precision Farming Dealer. Todd has testified before U.S. House and Senate subcommittees on ag data privacy issues.
