
SRA Indiana NRCS Cropland Priority Areas for Water



Soil Health Concerns . . .



- Researchers have shown that the windblown sediments can contain twice as much nitrogen and phosphorus and 20% more potassium than the soil left in place.
- •Wind erosion can help fill roadside and drainage ditches.
- •Others:
 - •Compaction = tile probe
 - •Loss of Organic Matter = soil tests


