INDIANA EQUIPMENT EXCHANGE OPENS ITS DOORS

Do you have any old assistive technology that you'd like to pass on to someone who could use it? Do you wish you could buy a piece of used assistive technology but just can't afford the cost of new equipment?

If so, then the Indiana Equipment Exchange Center (IEEC) is the place to call. With a toll free line, (800) 821-6708, and an updated database of both available and desired equipment, the IEEC is ready to match donors with appropriate recipients.

The demonstrated, documented need for the reuse and recycling of durable medical equipment and nonprescription assistive technology in the state of Indiana was first addressed by the IEEC nearly four

years ago. The objective of the center is to facilitate the low-cost transfer of used medical equipment to people in need.

In addition to being matched through the database, anyone who would like to buy or sell a piece of used equipment may be on the IEEC mailing list. A mailing will be done every two months, listing the available equipment and a phone number for the donor.



Man-Lifts for Sale

John Deere 6620 Series Combine Platform Lift - This farmer-built platform lift is powered by an electric winch and is operated with a small lever located at shoulder height. The steps were removed and the lift was bolted on in its place. It could be mounted on any 20 Series John Deere combine. The platform is designed to automatically stop if the cable breaks. A handrail is mounted for stability along with a crutch hanger. Al Copeland is asking \$2500 and can be reached at 317-326-8133.

Kubota L35 4WD Loader Tractor with Hydraulic Lift and Hand Controls - This tractor has only 45 hours on it and is adapted for a farmer or landscaper who needs a lift and hand controls to operate a tractor. The lift is hydraulically actuated and the lift seat docks into the tractor so no transfer is needed from the lift to the tractor. The starter switch, steering, hydraulics, and all other controls are located on the arm rests of the lift seat so they are readily accessible.
