Enclosed are copies of the bicycle parking surveys for the academic campus during the peak hours (1:30-2:30pm and 10:30-11:30am) when students are on campus. Counts at these locations were done in the early morning before students were on their way to classes.

Summary

The greatest number of bicycles parked on campus this semester is 935 bicycles on the academic campus during the peak class hours. (See Wednesday's 10:30am-11:30 am count. This number includes bikes in violation column.) Prior to 8 am the University Residences had 1412 bicycles and Purdue Village, 725 bicycles. (This number includes bikes in violation column).
