From last time:

 - SharePoint can grant specific permissions to specific folders for file upload. We would just need to add them individually to submission folder
 - Upload via Slack
 - Alternatively: upload to YouTube (poster presenter winners?)
- Brochure and invitations are finalized: waiting on conferences link

This week:

- Industrial Liaison:
 - Dr. Mentzer would like to contact his industrial contacts himself. Thus, I think a letter should be drafted that is slightly more general (i.e., no space to fill in each individual company and contact name) that Wei-Lee can sign as our president. This letter can be attached by Dr. Mentzer as a pdf.
 - There is a liaison team folder on Microsoft teams with the spreadsheet we will be using to go keep track of who we contact. We should be all ready to go once we get the website from conferences!
- Poster presentation framework:
 - Ask presenters to upload talks a few days before Symposium to screen them.
 - WebEx room for each personal presenter to answer questions in a particular timeslot.
 - For questions asked outside the timeslot, use Slack.
 - Figure out if limit on number of people in a WebEx room is an issue. Confirm with ECN.
- Slack updates
 - Possible to get free Slack Premium trial for Aug.
 - Slack is a better option for elevator talk uploads. Also minimizes number of platforms.
- Reminder for speaker submission to be sent out this week.
- Funding:
 - Funding required for speaker's travel requirements.
 - WebEx can facilitate recording, no funds needed for recording.
