Social- Kurt:

- Guidelines for events:
 - o Events must be on campus or virtual
 - o All events must have virtual option for those uncomfortable about attending
 - Food must be pre-packaged
 - Plan for enforcing Purdue protect policies is required

- o Plan for sanitizing surfaces must be made.
- Working on getting picnic approved through BoilerLink.
- Sent out email to students asking for event suggestions.
- GSO officers who work with international students in lab/office can ask them for event ideas.

Safety- David:

- Clarification from Kurt: Undergraduates can do research in labs for credit and pay if they register for on-campus classes.
- Undergrads will need to be trained on the Research Space SOP and will need to be added to this document, follow all the internal (group) rules and the lab schedule. They will not be allowed to work alone in the lab (this was applicable before Covid, anyways).
- They will also need to complete the safety training just like everyone, and log the completion of training (as described on our website). This will also be a requirement for approval to add the class to their schedule.

Student Advocacy- Aidan:

- Survey results not published yet.
- Idea: GSO Sponsored storage
 - o Bridge time mismatch between leaving grad students and incoming grad students
 - o \$70-100 per month for 10' x 10' storage unit.
 - Sustainable solution.
 - o Can have raffle to decide who gets it (fair solution).
 - Open to all ChemE grad students.
 - o Could be hepful for those that don't have means of furniture transportation.
- Suggestions:
 - Ask students/student groups about this? Does similar to this exist?
 - Hold year long? Or specific periods?
 - If temporary, we'll need to discard, sell or donate at the end of period.
 - Most students graduate in Spring on average. Could work as a summer long thing too.
 - Not a huge part of overally yearly budget (currently), but would need to be reevaluated in later years if budget ever goes down.
 - Other auxiliary ideas:
 - If people have a spare room, store items temporarily.
 - Sponsor week long UHaul rental
 - Have electronics/hardware exchange program.
