 - **44%**






Highway Program

- Drives S/L spending


Funding for Highways Under TEA-21 & SAFTEA-LU






Economic Stimulus

n House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee staffer Jim Berard's daily trip from the Annapolis, Md., area to Capitol Hill, the road turns

from asphalt to concrete as he approaches the District. Berard doesn't know why. It could be the weather, the

number of cars that travel on the road or any number of considerations that officials make when choosing how to build a road.

But one thing's for sure: With billions and billions of dollars worth of infrastructure projects at stake in the ongoing stimulus battle, asphalt and concrete lobbyists are now trying to convince federal lawmakers that their product is best for the task.






FY 2010 Appropriations

- President's Budget due February 2.
- FY 2010 Budget Resolution mid-March.
 - ◆Funding highways in 2010?
 - ♦ What to do with Bush tax cuts?
 - ◆Shrink the \$1 trillion deficit?
 - ◆Budget for Iraq and Afghanistan wars/pullout?
 - ◆Budget health care reform, climate change?
- Ends with FY 2010 Transportation/HUD Appropriations Bill by September 30.


Highway Trust Fund Shortfall

- \$8 billion rescue was from the general fund.
- Balance at end of Dec.= \$4.7 billion
- Another rescue needed.
- What does this mean for "user fee" funded highway system?

Highway Funding – No New Revenues



SAFETEA-LU Rescission

- SAFETEA-LU requires:
 - \$8.5 billion rescission of highway contract authority on Sep. 30.
 - Good political compromise.
 - Bad economic timing.
 - States planning for program reduction.
- Federal-aid highway funding in FY 2010 very problematic.
- → TCC Fly-In May 19-20.


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HMA Market Outlook

Annual Investment Requirements Highways & Bridges

- Strong Federal Role
- ◆Today = \$70 billion
- Maintain = \$185 billion
- → Improve = \$276 billion
- Increase Funding (All of the Above)
 - -25 to 40 cent fuel tax increase
 - Indexing
 - Tolling, Bonding, PPP's, etc...





Devolution Lite

- Stop sending funds to states
- Need to properly align supply and demand through pricing


Roadmap to Reauthorization







As President of the National Asphalt Pavement Association (NAPA), I would like to express our whole-hearted congratulations to you on your historic victory. NAPA stands ready to work with you and your Administration as you lead our country through this period of great economic uncertainty.

During the campaign you addressed many of the issues that NAPA's members see as critical in restoring our nation's economy and future prosperity, including the need to rebuild our nation's highways, roads, and bridges. You recognize the enormous negative impact deteriorating surface transportation infrastructure is having on America's global economy and the health and safety of its citizens. In fact, our nation's surface transportation infrastructure is in crisis.
